LOW-DOSE NALTREXONE (LDN) FOR AUTOIMMUNE TREATMENT

HOW LDN WORKS

LDN will temporarily block the body's natural endorphin receptors. The body will respond by giving a small boost of endorphins, that in turn causes the immune system to stop making antibodies against the thyroid. Over time, the antibodies disappear.

LDN works best as a piece of your whole program to achieve good health. Gut health is particularly important with autoimmune thyroid issues.

LDN DOSING PROTOCOL

- First month: 1.5 mg at bedtime
- Second month: 3.0 mg at bedtime
- Third month and beyond: 4.5 mg at bedtime

Important: Minimal or no alcohol is advisable during the treatment period. LDN should not be taken in conjunction with narcotics.

High dose Naltrexone (50-150 mg) is used with addicts to stop cravings and help them wean from substances.

COMMON SIDE EFFECTS

Side effects are rare with LDN. A small percentage of patients experience wakefulness at night or vivid dreams. In these instances, we move dosing to the morning.
